

What Would You Do?

Please read the following scenarios and select the FIRST step you would take to address the situation?

Scenario 1:

A fourth grade student brought a knife to school and showed it to his friends. His friends reported this to you.

- Meet with the student to re-teach the expected behavior
- Document a minor or major offense in the SIS
