As a first-generation college student and someone who has had varied experiences trying to live life to the fullest, I felt a calling to empower youth and equip them with the tools they need to self-actualize and take responsibility for making good things happen in their own lives."

Lisa is committed to making a difference for today's youth by nurturing self-actualization and equipping them with the tools they need for school and for life. With strong problem-solving skills, project management abilities, and a systems thinker approach, Lisa has proven successful in establishing innovative practices and efficient systems.

Currently an Executive Director, National School Counseling Leadership Conference Coordinator, and a PL Specialist/Consultant for Hatching Results, Lisa is a former K-8 school counselor whose social-emotional learning (SEL) and career readiness initiatives earned her the Oppenheimer Recognition Award, which resulted in a large Illinois SEL/Mental Health grant award and her school's selection as one of only six to become a *model elementary school* in Chicago (approx. 450 total elementary schools at the time). During more than six years at the district office as Lead K-8 Counselor for hundreds of school counselors, she participated in the formation of the K-12 School Counseling and Postsecondary Advising Office, developed K-12 professional learning and resources, managed staff and special projects, led policy development and initiatives such as performance evaluation development and the removal of case management duties from school counselors, and conducted school visits throughout the city to work with counselors and administrators. She even received the inaugural Golden Child award from the Office of College & Career Success. An Education Pioneer Visiting Fellow, Lisa was recognized for her systemic change efforts at the District Office, Chicago Teachers' Union, and at the Illinois School Counselor Association (ISCA) as a Board member with the School Counselor Advocate of the Year award in 2015. More than anything, she believes in school counseling and is a fierce advocate for comprehensive, data-driven school counseling programs for all students!
