Prior to this role, Tanya was a high school counselor for 20 years in the Grossmont Union High School District working at both the site and district level. Tanya is also an adjunct instructor for the School of Education at Point Loma Nazarene University teaching graduate students in the school counseling program. She has also been a field supervisor at the University of San Diego and taught at Cuyamaca College. Tanya was recently accepted into the doctoral program for Educational Leadership at the University of Southern California and will start Fall 2022.

- Received the 2012 Frank Jonasson Endowment Award for leading school counselors through the implementation of a districtwide graduation requirement, requiring that all high school seniors graduate with a post-secondary plan.
- Received the highest honor as one of ten Quest for the Best recipients during my undergrad program at San Diego State University for leadership and service to my school and community.
